
As with any organization, there are several advantages for being an active leader or committee chair in the Milwaukee Sail & Power Squadron. Among them:

#### **BOATING SAFETY**

#### **Importance of Boating Education**





The basic boating course has taught us the fundamentals of safe boating. Many of you have taken additional courses. You realized how much more there is to learn.

Safe boating and boating knowledge should not only be the responsibility of the skipper, but also his shipmate and crew. Everyone should know how to handle an emergency, not only of your own boat but also other boaters in distress.

The number one safeguard is knowledge. To help us USPS has developed many good courses. These courses are designed for the experienced boater as well as for the beginner. Acquiring boating knowledge should become a family affair. Our instructors are sensitive to the abilities of every student and are ready to help in understanding the subject matter. To enhance the courses members often will relate their personal experiences.

The Seamanship course provides basic information and is valuable for the beginner and as a refresher course for the experienced boater. The Advanced Grade Courses relate to the basic principles of piloting a boat.

Everyone on board should know the boat's electrical system, how the engine works, and what to do in case of failure of the systems. It is often very important to understand how to predict bad weather. The basic ability to judge oncoming weather has saved many boaters.

Become an expert and take advantage of the courses offered. Don't jeopardize family and friends by ignoring safety standards on the water.
