5th (Sat)—Vessel Safety Checks - McKinley Marina If you have ever run aground, you know it is an experience you will never be able to quite explain. Even the most careful boater can experience a sudden, unscheduled stop, compliments of an unseen underwater obstruction.



Running aground is a dramatic situation which requires you to keep a clear head. There may be times when immediate action may free your boat with little or no damage. However, your first concern is always the condition of your passengers and crew. Check for injuries and determine if they are serious enough to require immediate attention.

After ensuring there are no serious injuries, check the damage to your boat. Keels, rudders and/or drive shafts may be torn away, the hull may have a gaping hole. If you cannot make temporary repairs, call for help.

If your boat is not seriously damaged or sinking, take soundings around the boat to find which way the deep water lies. Determine if wind and current are carrying your boat harder aground, and set an anchor toward deep water.

Decrease the draft of your boat. Move weight and crew to the bow, which may break the bottom suction, or shift the weight of the crew rapidly from side to side. If you are not hard aground, try backing down with your engine. Before starting your engine, check the raw water strainers to ensure they are not clogged with sand or gravel.

If you have a sailboat you can set a hedge anchor off the deep water beam, attach the main halyard to its rode, and use the halyard winch to try to heel the boat over. You might also set an anchor astern, make a bridle and connect the anchor rode to both sheet winches, then try to crank your way off.

In the event you cannot get your vessel off the bottom until help comes or high tide sets in, protect the hull as best as you can. Pad it with any kind of cushioning material. Set boat hooks, whisker poles, or anything else against the sheer as braces.

Keep these procedures in mind for the coming boating season. With the low water levels of recent years, you never know when you might need them.
